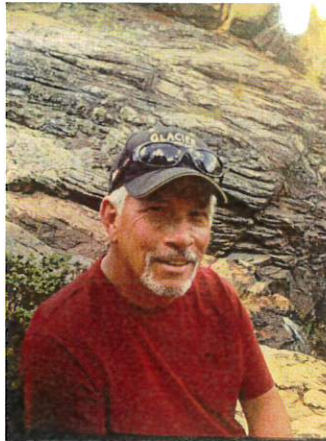


Brian Q. Hoagland December 26, 1955 - July 18, 2020
