Brent Lewis Holman passed away peacefully on February 28, 2024, at the age of 70. He was born on September 1, 1953, in Payson, Utah, to Lewis Max and Norma Jean Bame Holman, the oldest of four children. After graduating from Payson High School in 1971, Brent attended Utah State University in Logan, Utah from 1971 to 1974, in which he graduated with a degree in Agricultural Machinery. He married the love of his life, Nancy Lee Crook, on January 21, 1977, in the Manti Temple. Together they raised three children and created and shared many happy memories throughout their 47 years of marriage.

In 1977, Brent was hired by Provo City as one of their diesel mechanics and he and Nancy settled and spent the rest of their lives together in Provo where they made numerous lifelong friends.
