Volunteer of the Month



Tyler Warner is our July 2022 Volunteer of the Month. Tyler is a US Army Veteran, having served from 2008 to 2012, and is a diesel mechanic, owning his own mobile diesel repair business called WNR Mobile. Tyler owns a demolition derby team called Wrecked Neck Racing. This year, he created a mentorship program through the team, and has donated 5 cars to 4 local high schools (Payson High Auto, Payson High Welding, Provo High Welding, Maple Mountain Welding, and the Salem ALC). He is teaching the teens in this program how to build derby cars. All of the money to get this program started came out of his own pocket; and on his own time, he cycles through all the schools to help guide the students with their cars. This summer, these cars will be competing in Utah's first ever high school rivalry heat. Tyler has done this to highlight the importance of technical trades and to give a hands-on learning opportunity to the youth in our community.

Tyler attended Wyotech in Laramie, Wyoming, to become a diesel mechanic. Born in Elko, Nevada, he moved around a bit, then decided to settle down in Santaquin in 2016.

Sarisha Martin, his soon-to-be bride, works along with Tyler to find sponsors for the program. They are engaged to be married in October of this year and are raising three children together. They enjoy hunting, fishing, hiking, and anything outdoors together as a family.

Thank you, Tyler, for encouraging the trades for our youth. Your example of a true mentor will enrich the lives of these teens for many years to come.

Greetings Friends and Neighbors,

As I begin this month's newsletter, I want to wish all of the citizens in Santaquin the best summer ever and to remind everyone to stay safe and have fun. This is a great time of year and living in Santaquin helps us all realize that we live in the best place in the world.

Over the past few weeks we have had some great advancements on issues around our city. Norm Beagley and I attended the kickoff meeting with the US Federal Highways team, the Forest Service and the contractor for the canyon roadway repairs. The contractor is now mobilizing equipment and supplies to begin work in a short time.

Phase I will be finished in a couple of months barring any unforeseen issues. Phase II money is approved and the contractor is in negotiations with the US Federal Highways contracting department to start work on that as soon as they can finalize contract negotiations.

The Forest Service will work on Tinney Flat separately beginning soon and most likely will work from the upper end as the bridge is not repaired at Cold Spring in Santaquin Canyon yet.

We meet regularly with the CUP in review of progress and expectation for construction in our area. The CUP team is working to ensure all easements and agreements are made with landowners and finalizing the 30% reviews. Once complete the 60% review will follow shortly and selection of contractors to do the work will follow after that. The CUP water will be at our door very soon and the engineering staff at Santaquin City is fully engaged in ensuring all of our connections and system will be utilized to the fullest.

This past month we have been able to present the facts and make a case to secure another piece of the corridor realignment of the east side Frontage Road utilizing Utah County corridor preservation funds. Mountainland Association of Governments awarded a full sum to purchase this land from a willing seller. This saves the city a lot of money and allows us to prepare the area for further engineering that needs to be completed and a desire to move the replacement of the interchange upward from a 30+ year estimate they have given us. We are working to help this move along.

We continue work on the industrial park and are working closely with industries around the region to help bring in businesses that will add jobs and revenues that will help our area. This is ongoing and we as a council are looking at all options to make this successful for Santaquin.

The Budget has been approved and we will march into the 2022/2023 year by not raising taxes and by ensuring we are being responsible for all monies entrusted to us. Our fiscal condition is in very good shape.

The Prospector View Mountain Bike Park is underway with the engineering, permitting, and soon to be construction of our parking lot located just a few hundred feet from the Forest Service cattle guard. Work will begin very soon with heavy equipment moving earth, and within a few months time, a new restroom along the canyon road. Trails are being marked and the bridge will soon be underway as well. This will be a great addition to our recreation facilities and for hikes in many areas that most have not walked. These will be hiking and biking trails for all to enjoy.

Thanks to you all for the many good things you do for this city, the hours of service you render, and for your attendance at the weekly events. We will see you at the Santaquin Orchard Days Celebration and invite you to plan to participate in every way. This year will be great!
