Pressurized Irrigation to Entire City

With the completion of the new PI water tank, Summit Ridge will now have secondary water in the irrigation system. This means that the water running through the sprinkling systems is NOT potable, not drinkable. It includes water from the city's Water Reclamation Facility (along with other sources) which has processed and reused more than two billion gallons of water thus far for our residents. It is highly recommended that water filters be installed on all sprinkling systems. To learn more about these filters and their ease of use, refer to this video


