#### Greetings Friends and Neighbors,

As February is getting underway and we look forward to spring, many things have been happening to prepare the city for 2022. We have been able to begin this new year and new administration with some great news with only five weeks under our belts.

I realize when I talk of parks it may be getting a little old, but our mountain bike park in the canyon is moving along. I'm

happy to report that new groups and supporters are stepping in to help. Engineering is underway and Construction will begin soon on the trails, a new parking lot, and some volunteer service activities are planned that will bring our city together.



The pickleball courts at the sports fields near Summit Ridge are making headway. With good weather, the work has enjoyed a little jump start and we are hoping to have games underway by early summer. The work on the Pressurized Irrigation (PI) Tank at Summit Ridge



is moving along and will deliver PI water this summer as well. This final phase of our PI system will take pressure off our culinary system and allow the secondary water to be used in all outdoor watering citywide. We saved money on this project when the previous administration purchased some materials before costs went up. Thank you, Mayor Hunsaker, and all the previous decision makers that made this project possible.

There is mass grading underway at the Gray Cliffs development on the northeast of the city

in what used to be the Sumsion sand pit. Many people have asked what is going on there, so I recently met with Steve Larsen, the property owner and developer. His vision will take some time before we see it take shape in the form of roads and lots. However, this development has been well thought-out with the placement of commercial near the highway, with larger lots, and with unique outdoor opportunities.



To all that have voiced concern over traffic, especially on Main Street to the interchange, our engineering is underway, and construction will be begin in 2023 to widen Main Street to five lanes. This will be a time of patience and commitment but in the end, we will see some great changes take place. In January we had talks with UDOT concerning needed changes

to help move traffic at the I-15 interchange at Main Street. Some plans have been presented which initially gave us a little immediate hope, but we learned that to advance the timeline, a more comprehensive study is needed to make sure the necessary changes are done correctly is required. Then in early February I met with the Mountainland Association of Governments (MAG) to propose a study for the area from 400



East to 900 East along Main Street. This additional study will include an analysis of proposed interchange enhancement and possible rebuild options and their effect on our local roads, such as needed improvement to the interstate off ramps and improvement to Highland Drive and 900 East Street intersections so that we can provide better transportation access and flow. The first request was denied by a technical group from MAG; but in early February, due to efforts made by our government leadership, the funding started falling into place to begin the study to plan safe traffic flow, interchange enhancements, and future traffic patterns that take into account our residential and commercial growth as well as improve access to future schools to the north on 400 East. This work should help accelerate the timeline and help us to begin the changes so the traffic will flow more smoothly. It may also lead to updating our interchange sooner than anticipated.

I am working hard for this city. I have been working as your mayor forty plus hours each week. I take my elected position seriously and I am working to resolve the issues that affect us all. Thank you for the positive remarks, the kind help, and your volunteerism. Santaquin is the best!
