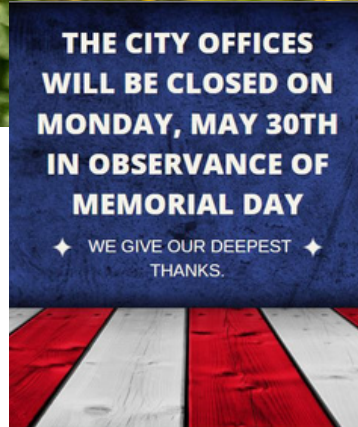

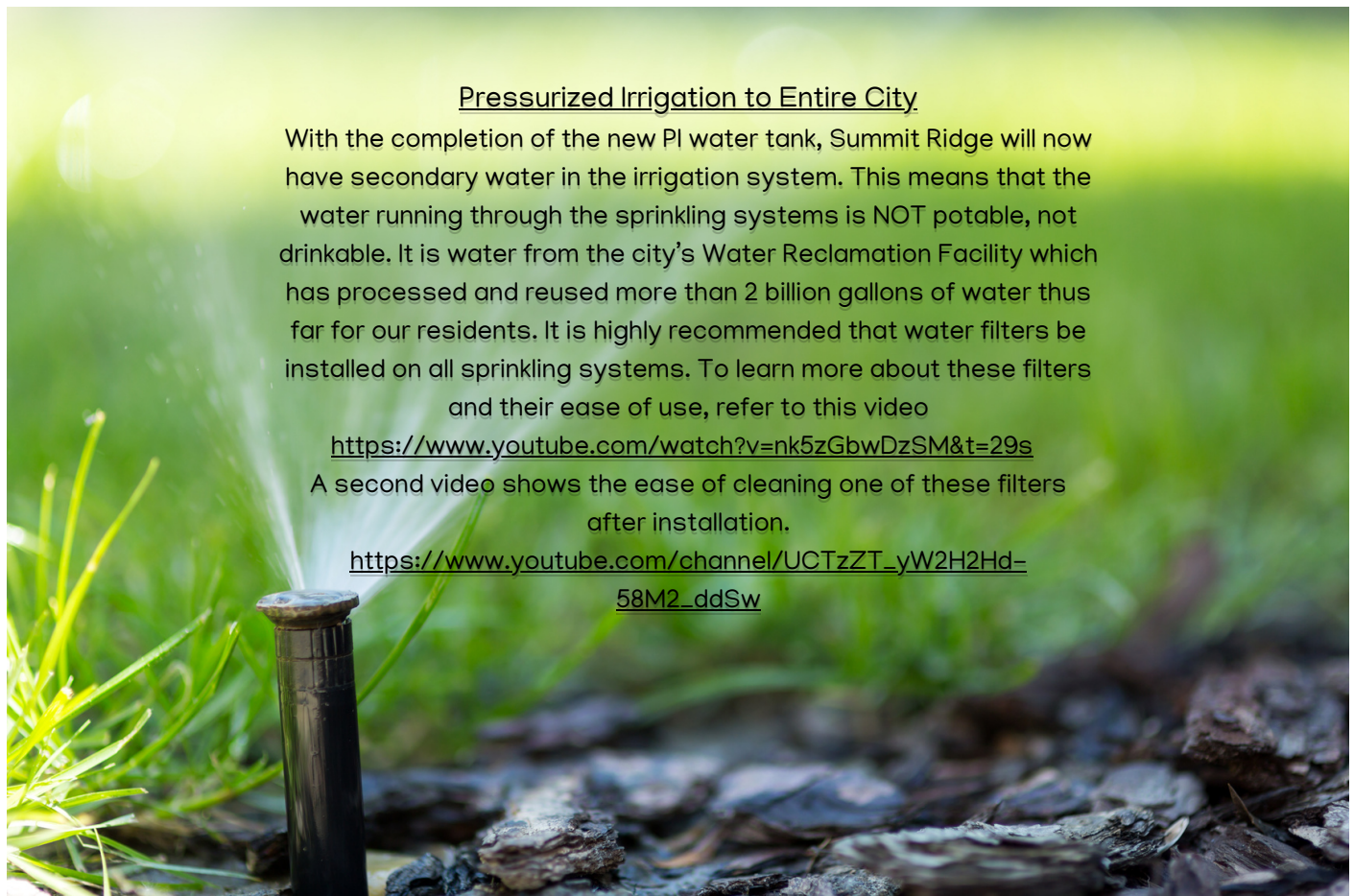


Volunteer of the Month

Ken Coon is our May 2022 Volunteer of the Month. Ken is a huge believer in being a volunteer and encourages friends, family, and coworkers about how easy it is to help others for even a few hours a week. His volunteer work started in 2007 after he had a scare where he needed to receive fifteen units of blood in three days. After he recovered, he decided to give back by delivering blood for the Red Cross. He drives from Midvale, Utah, across the state line into Idaho, every-other-weekend with donated blood. Later he decided to start helping at the Loveland Living Planet Aquarium. He apparently loves the ocean, so his volunteer work there is as much for his own enjoyment as it is to help the aquarium. According to his wife Karen, "He always tell our kids to find something you love and help!"

Ken has also been delivering for Meals-On-Wheels once a week for almost four years. When he started driving for them, there was not a need here in Santaquin for a driver, so once a week Ken and Karen would deliver meals in Provo. Pressurized Irrigation to Entire City

With the completion of the new PI water tank, Summit Ridge will now have secondary water in the irrigation system. This means that the water running through the sprinkling systems is NOT potable, not drinkable. It is water from the city's Water Reclamation Facility which has processed and reused more than 2 billion gallons of water thus far for our residents. It is highly recommended that water filters be installed on all sprinkling systems. To learn more about these filters and their ease of use, refer to this video

Greetings from the Mayor's desk,

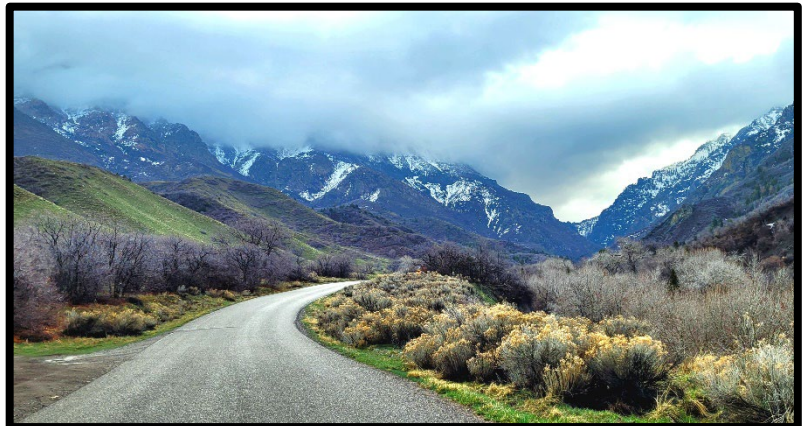
As April got underway, I received news that our city manager was taking an opportunity to move to a new endeavor. I would like to say a few things to the citizens of our city regarding this change. Ben Reeves has been a loyal employee to Santaquin through three mayors and multiple council changes. My experience with Ben started in the first few days of his hiring. For the past 12+ years I have worked with him on budgets for the Fire Department and many other things. I have seen the good he has accomplished and know Ben to be a gracious, invested, and kind individual. I wish I did not have to see him leave and hoped he might stay. He does so on his own accord and with the ability to take his family on a new adventure. I want to wish him the very best and let him know there are many people who he has touched their life for the good. I know he will be a great public servant to the residents of Iowa. Ben, I wish for you the best of luck in all your endeavors.

We are now over a hundred days into this new administration. With changes and challenges, we are moving forward and doing our best to make sure the city operates per state laws and statutes. In making sure our newest state code changes are ready to be implemented, the city council and I attended the Utah League of Cities and Towns yearly convention in St. George, to be briefed and taught regarding those latest changes. Each new state code will be studied further, but implementation will be the date the laws are signed into effect.

Here is an update to some of the priorities I have been keeping an eye on:

- The construction of our pickleball courts is making great headway but time frames for finishing may be affected by late spring weather. We are pushing to get the Harvest View Park online as quickly as possible.
- The contractor on the Summit Ridge Pressurized Irrigation Water Storage Tank and Booster Pump Project is making great headway and our hope is to have the connections made and pipe laid by the end of the summer.
- I have been meeting with the congressional delegation to ask for funding for updates to Main Street and the interchange of I-15 to a new 900 East collector. Finding funding for projects has been a lot of work but there have been many successes in getting our projects lined up.
- We are working with the Utah County Commission to secure funding and their help on meeting our infrastructure needs and those commitments are going as planned. The commissioners have also been engaged with the changes to the county line to solidify our city's boundaries, so parcels are not divided.
- I am currently working on the new Prospector View Canyon Park with slow, but sure, movement. I have also been working with the Forest Service and the Federal Highway Commission to get our canyon open. All is moving at a government pace, but we are pushing as need to jump start these projects.

We have an incredible city with the best citizens anyone can ask for. Thank you for the support and all the help you give in making Santaquin the home we love.
