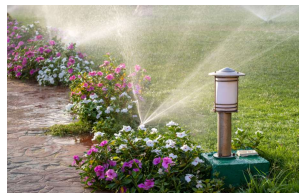

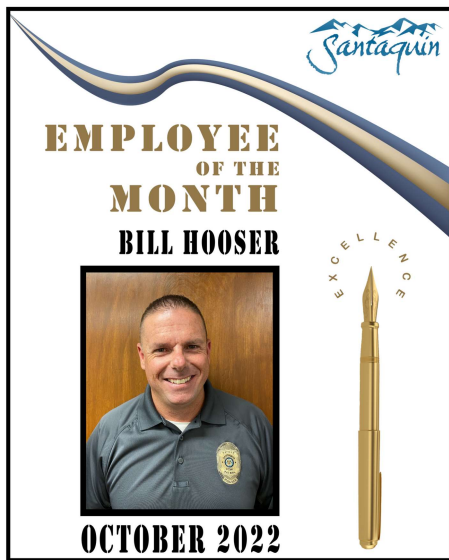

From the Mayor's Desk



Greetings for October,

The following information is in regard to the work that the city has put in to help move along the availability of high-speed internet in the Santaquin area. Keep in mind as you read this that all service providers are encouraged to find a way to provide as high of a speed as possible to those homes that need high speed internet for business, home occupation, or whatever the need. Santaquin does not promote one provider over another. This report shows the manner in which one provider is working to give the entire city high speed fiber connections to every home. Other providers may be able to do the same, but no information has been provided by them to date.

A couple years ago, after the COVID 19 pandemic hit, Santaquin City was looking into how to bring fiber internet into our community. In so doing, we reached out to CentraCom and learned that they had a plan to bring gigabyte service to all homes and businesses in Santaquin. This was great news! Since then, the City has supported CentraCom's efforts.

At the present time, it is our understanding from CentraCom that they have now built out their system within two large segments of town. Most of the newest areas of town that have been

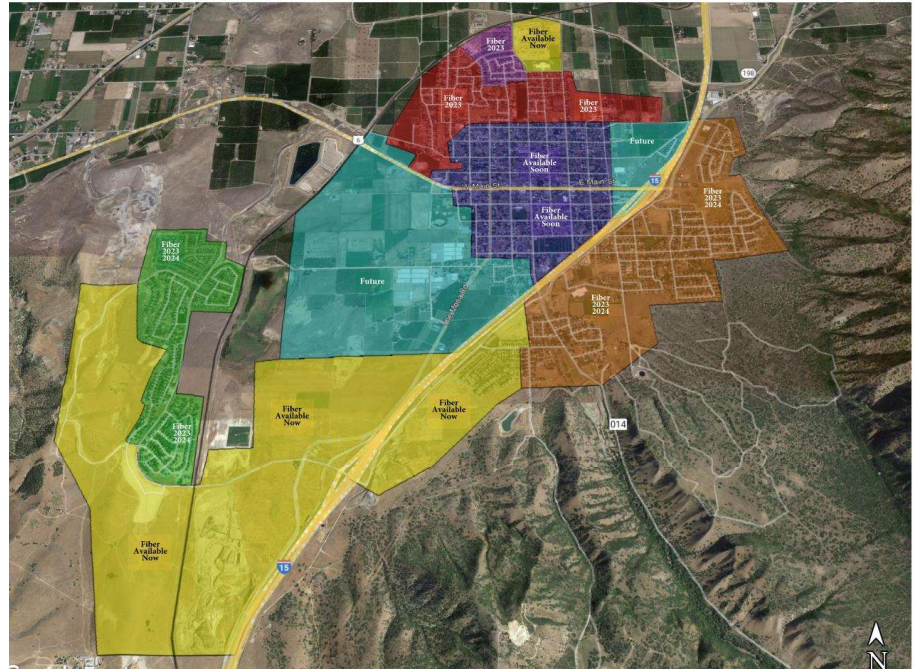

constructed within the last several years (see the yellow areas on the map on the next page) currently have CentraCom high-speed fiber internet service available to residences and businesses.

Additionally, within the area that we refer to as our “Core” area of Santaquin (see the dark purple area on the map), CentraCom will soon have high-speed fiber internet service available to residences and businesses. For those of you that live within one of the two areas described above, we suggest you contact CentraCom if you have any questions and or if you have a desire to obtain high-speed internet service from them. Lastly, there are other areas of the city (see the areas in red, orange, green, and light purple on the map).

These are the areas of Santaquin where conduits for fiber do not currently exist. These areas were constructed from about 1995 to about 2018-2019. Without conduits installed for fiber optic cable, these areas present the biggest challenge for CentraCom (or any provider) to provide this higher speed fiber service to residents. The City has been and will continue to work with CentraCom to find solutions that will allow them to install the needed conduits, allowing them to provide their high-speed fiber service to all homes and businesses within Santaquin City. Their goal is providing gig speeds as soon as possible.

In Other news, the new city building is moving steadily along and is still several months from completion. We look forward to that day.

At the Harvest View sports park near the south interchange, we will be holding a ribbon cutting on October 18th at 4:30 pm with games and other planned activities.

The mountain bike park “Prospectors View” is steadily moving along with new things happening there each week. Progress is slow and steady, but this park will grow monthly and even through the winter in some ways. Trails are underway from flagging to creation of the actual trails. The bridge is in the infancy stage and the restrooms will be installed there in a couple weeks’ time.

Further work is progressing on Main Street as well as a study and planning to alleviate the traffic problems. We have initiated many projects in conjunction with the state and federal government, including MAG funding to provide solutions in less time than what was given to us at the beginning of this year. We are finding much success and we look forward to providing help in ways to make our lives better here in Santaquin.
