

be on any sidewalks, streets, alleys, or public places in the City between the established curfew hours of 11:00 pm and 5:00 am unless the minor is with a parent, guardian, or other responsible adult having care and custody of minor. Another exception is if the minor has employment that requires them to be on the sidewalks, streets, in alleys, or public places while working or traveling to or from such employment. It is permitted also if the minor is on an emergency errand directed by their parent, legal guardian, or other responsible person having care and custody or in a motor vehicle engaged in normal interstate travel ending in the City; attending or traveling between minor's home or place of residence and a place where any religious, Municipal, social, entertainment, sporting, political, library, or school function is occurring; or within the boundaries of the minor's place of residence.

The week prior to the parade on Saturday morning, the Veterans held a flag raising ceremony to kick off our celebration. We honored Jake Kester this year. The kind words expressed at that flag raising ceremony not only gave hope in our great nation, but honored one of Santaquin's finest.

As the flag ceremony was ending, the Little Buck-A-Roo rodeo got underway. For those of you who have not attended this wonderful event, I suggest you put it on your calendar for next year. I was told by many of the spectators that this Santaquin Little Buck-A-Roo rodeo is the best in the state. The Little Buck-A-Roo rodeo lasted nearly 14 hours. I have to say the volunteers and all of the City staff made this event run great and everyone did an outstanding job. Thank you to all and especially to Paige Steele who is Santaquin's backbone for this Little Buck-A-Roo rodeo. Paige also does a great job helping with our PRCA rodeo that was held the last weekend of our Orchard Days celebration.

I thank the sponsors, the participants, and every citizen who took time to experience every aspect of this year's Orchard Days events. John Bradley, our Community Services Director, was especially involved to ensure all aspects were well covered. Thank you all!

May I give a special thanks for the car show, the family night, games in the park, the tours of the museum, the home run derby, the grand parade, the Grand Marshal (Marilyn Clayson), the children's parade, and every other part of the Orchard Days celebration that I may have missed. It was tremendous.

Our hometown markets and concerts in the city park continue through September 26th. There is/are great produce, meals, and wares offered each week. This is such a fun event to walk through and purchase for the family. The concerts, bands, and other performers have just been incredible. You really do need to hear these professionals and budding professionals. They perform for a couple of hours each Monday night of our Home Town Market. Each week, families are able to sit in the park and visit with so many good friends as well as make new friends. These are another item to be placed on your calendar and not to miss.

On other news, the canyon repairs will not be completed this fall. Negotiations for final pricing could not be mutually accepted between the contractor and the Federal Highway Administration. The Phase Two contract is being re-bid in the coming weeks for work to begin next summer. I have been talking with all involved, as well as including Congressman Owens' office and Senator Romney's office. Both of which are contacting the Federal Highway group to keep it rolling. I have also requested that the district Ranger please open the canyon up to Trumbolt until November so we can use Trumbolt picnic area and drive to the parking lot. More news to come at a later date on these two items.

Lastly, I wanted to update all on the mountain bike park. Prospector View mountain bike park parking lot has been created with two drive approaches, rotomill asphalt was laid and is yet to be compacted. We have determined the appropriate area for the new restroom location, the lighting installation coordinates, and in September, the disturbed soil will be sprayed with hydroseeding. The approaches will be prepared with a pipe to allow storm drainage to move along the roadway. The bridge design was submitted to the State for approval. This will be a pole type bike and pedestrian bridge that crosses the stream. Proposed trails are now being marked with tape and our mountain bike trail committee is giving input on possible trail routes. These routes will soon be underway. This mountain bike park was only proposed in the first week of January and we are to the point that riders will soon be able to traverse some trails where they have never before ridden. What a fun park we are creating.

My wish is that you can all have the very best closure to your summer and prepare for the most fun fall with recreation programs for old and young. We love this place!
