

# Mayor's Message | August Newsletter



As you read this message, Orchard Days will be in full swing and I hope you're able to enjoy all of the community activities. This year's events are planned to be the biggest ever. We anticipate record-breaking attendance and have planned for dozens of activities that the entire family can enjoy. The hustle and bustle in our community reminds me of the growth we've seen over the past decade, with the number of homes in Santaquin more than doubling. This unprecedented growth has brought wonderful opportunities but also significant challenges. One of those challenges has been funding vital emergency services to so many more people. As many of you know, the city is facing a budget shortfall and is responsibly and proactively planning ahead for growth through a proposal to increase property taxes. This decision did not come lightly. For the last year and a half, we dug deep into the city's finances to identify budget cuts that reduced our expenditures by nearly ten percent. We halted needed building repairs, reduced staffing levels, and delayed equipment purchases.

To increase revenues, we actively engaged federal and state partners, and pursued grants and other funding opportunities. We have worked to create a business-friendly environment that allows the private sector to flourish. The City has proactively attracted new businesses to the community and incentivized existing businesses to stay in town. This has helped to diversify our revenues, provide additional budget stability and minimize residents' tax burden.

"2023 Cost of City Government Report" Utah Taxpayers Association. I am a fiscal conservative who does not like the prospect of raising taxes. After years of diligent financial discipline, the City has grown its budget reserves from less than 5% in 2009 to 35% last year, which is the maximum amount allowed by state law. We have worked hard to earn an AA+ credit rating from S & P Global, an independent, third-party credit rating agency. This AA+ credit rating ultimately saves residents tens of thousands of dollars in lower interest rates over time.

The Utah Taxpayers Association has taken notice of our excellent fiscal management. The association recently released their annual 2023 Cost of City Government Report. We're pleased to announce that Santaquin City ranks in the top five as one of the best cities in Utah to keep the tax burden low for our residents.

Over the past few months, I have had the privilege of meeting with many of you about the property tax increase. I have met with you in your homes, places of business, and at the City offices. We have sent email updates, text messages, hosted public meetings and town halls, and posted regularly on social media about the proposal. We continue to work to make this city the best it can be and want to assure each resident we are responsibly engaged to make Santaquin a sustainable city now and as we move forward.

While it wasn't always easy conversations to have, I appreciated all of you who were willing to engage with us on these important issues and add your voice to the process. We are better for it!
