#### Water Meter Ordinance

Please keep your water and Pl meters accessible at all times. City ordinance states: "Free access shall at all reasonable times be allowed to the superintendent of the water department or other authorized person to all places supplied with service from the water system to examine the apparatus, the amount of water used, and the manner of use, and to perform such duties as they may have under this chapter. It shall be unlawful to obstruct in any way the ability of authorized personnel to gain access to the premises' water meter. It shall also be unlawful to place any material in the water meter barrel without the written approval of the superintendent of the water department. (Ord. 2-2-99, 2-2-1999; amd. Ord. 03-02-2004, 3-17-2004, eff. 3-18-2004; Ord. 09-03-2011, 9-7-2011, eff. 9-8-2011)"

Brook Huntington is our March 2023 Volunteer of the Month. She has been coaching our recreation cross-country team for several years. According to John Bradley, our Community Services Director, "Brook Huntington is a fabulous volunteer for Santaquin Recreation. She jumped in right away when we started the youth cross-country running program and has coached for three years. Not only did she want to help coach three of her children, she wanted to help all the youth participants be healthier. Cross-country is for boys and girls ages 7–14. They train and run different length running events. Her goal is to help everyone be a little better than they were the previous running event. Unlike other sports, Brook is the only coach for a team of between 25–30 runners each year. When she is not

coaching, she is working with her husband at their business, Huntington Dental, in Santaquin. They are proud supporters of the Payson High School Cross-Country running program. They have had three children compete on the Payson High School team, with one taking all-region in some events. Thank you, Brook, for your commitment to helping develop the youth of Santaquin."

#### Hello, and greetings from the Mayor,

March is underway, yet I write this when it is 20 degrees outside, and snow is covering the city. We often wonder when we will see the end of the cold weather and the beginning of spring.

At this time of year, we are starting to see temperatures come up a bit, the grass appearing, the sun shining longer and the legislature wrapping up its session. We have great things happening at the legislature and have done

all we can to make way for new funding for projects around our city. In March, we will know the outcome of all the hours we have put into anticipated changes for the City. There will be more to come as we get that news.

I wanted to write about preparations for high runoff water this coming year. As you may all know, we have had an exceptional year for snowpack in the mountains. As of Valentine's Day, we have 19.5 inches of water in the snow in Santaquin canyon. This represents over two months ahead of a regular water year. More snow and rain over the coming weeks will add to our spring runoff.

Generally, the high runoff water starts around the first week of April and will ramp up as the temperatures increase. We should see peaks in May. We will work diligently to maintain the best control possible of all of the waters that flow from the canyons.

To ensure you are all aware, the committee that manages flood mitigation and high runoff water consists of Santaquin City, the Utah County engineer, the Utah County maintenance dept., Summit Creek Irrigation and Canal Company, and others. We have met with this committee and will continue to meet monthly and then possibly bi-weekly as we near the high-water season. These meetings ensure that attention is being paid to all details and eyes are on every area where issues may occur.

If you are contacted by a member of Summit Creek Irrigation and Canal Company or Santaquin City as we prepare by cleaning culverts under driveways or areas where irrigation water runs around or through your property, please do all you can to help us prevent washouts.

I wanted to send a reminder that ditches will be full, water will be diverted to farms, fields, and reservoirs. If you are new to the city, please ask us if you have any questions.

It is my hope that writing this letter will give comfort in knowing the flood committee is working to ensure that all are as safe as possible and that property is protected the very best that we can. Families can be reassured that these groups are working together to prepare in advance. With preparation, we strive to ensure high runoff water is controlled through the system in the best way humanly possible.

May we have the best spring ever and may each of you enjoy the month of March.
