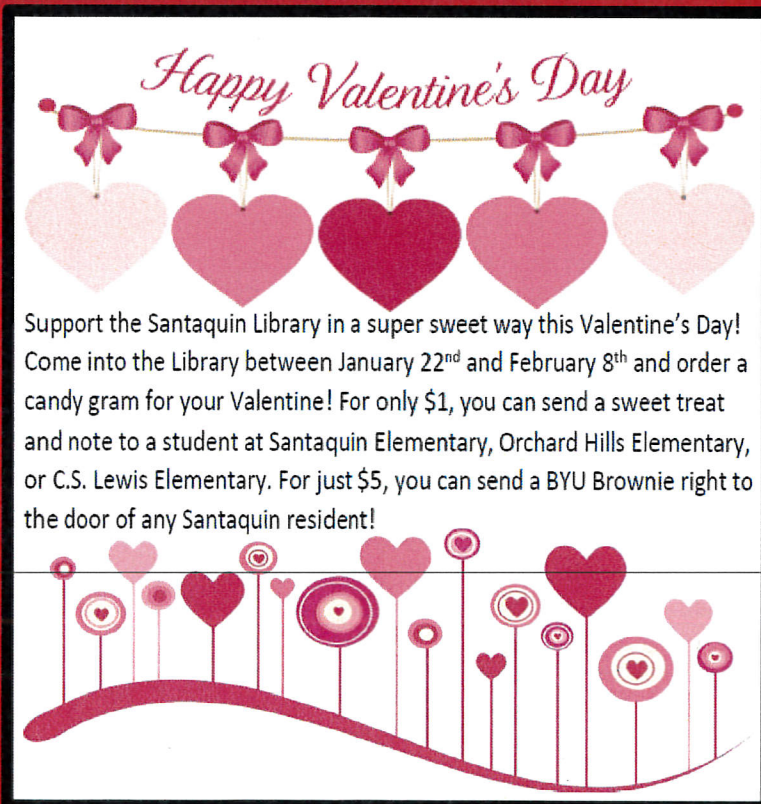

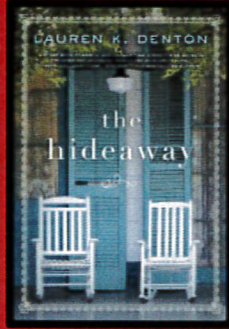

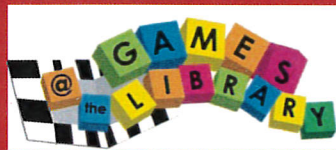
Book Club

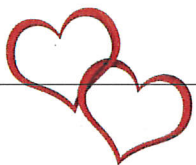

Please contact Suzy McDowell at smcdowell@santaquin.org if you have not received emergency notifications in the past and would like to receive them in the future. This especially holds true for those who are renting since the city may have the landlord's information on file instead of the renter. In the event of an emergency or outage, we want to get the word out as quickly as possible to everyone. Please take the time to sign up so you can get a text, an email, or a phone call in the event of an emergency.
