Santaquin Licensing & Low Cost Rabies Clinic


The clinic will be held at the Fire Dept: 275 W Main, Santaquin on June 9th, 2018 from 10 am to 12 pm.








Veteran's Car Show

Dear Santaquin Residents and Friends,

The first thing I want to do in this month's newsletter is to express my appreciation to all those members of our community who have served in our military, both past and present, and have sacrificed so much to preserve our freedoms. I also want to express my appreciation to our Fire Department, and all those who labored to honor our service members with their Annual Memorial Day Breakfast. What a wonderful event it is each and every year for our community to gather as one.

On the topic of veterans and service members, many of you have been asking about the future of our Senior Citizen Center and American Legion Hall. On May 23^{rd} we held a joint meeting of the Santaquin City

Council and Seniors Board to review the efforts that have been made on many different options that would better meet their long-term needs. Our seniors and veterans deserve a safe and healthy facility and every effort is being made to find a long-term solution. In the meantime, the seniors and veterans will continue to use their existing facility for another year.

As many of you know, the City is in the process of remodeling its old public works building next to Santaquin Elementary into a small recreation center that will allow us to move our recreation department out of the old building into a newer and safer facility. Unfortunately, it will not expand the square footage for our current offerings. However, we are very pleased that a group of passionate and energetic residents have come together to explore the possibility of building a newer larger Recreation Center that will allow us to grow and better meet the needs of our community today and into the future. They are in the process of developing survey questions to gather the input of our residents regarding what services and offerings you might want in such a center in balance with what we can afford as a community. With enough positive feedback, they may even seek for your signatures of support towards their endeavor. We, as city leaders and staff, wholeheartedly support their efforts and will help to facilitate their community engagement efforts.

Should our residents support a newer and larger Recreation Center, it is possible that the facility we are currently constructing could be modified to be used for our seniors and veterans programs, in addition to it being used in support of our concerts and rodeos. We applaud the efforts of our civic minded community to engage in, and take it upon themselves, activities that will help to enhance the quality of life of all of our residents. As a city, we are excited to support every effort and every good idea.

With that said, another group working to make our city an even better place to live, is the Community Service Committee. These great people are leading a service project on June 2nd for a local family in need. We need your help as well. 
