



### Office Closure

The City Offices will be closed Wednesday, July 4<sup>th</sup> in observance of Independence Day and Tuesday, July 24<sup>th</sup> in observance of Pioneer Day.



2018 Santaquin Fireworks Restrictions No fireworks are allowed east of I-15 or in the Summit Ridge area.



There has been a new State law passed about using fireworks, resulting in fewer days over all as compared to previous years. Fireworks may only be discharged:

July 2<sup>nd</sup> – July 5<sup>th</sup> (July 4<sup>th</sup> hours extended to midnight)

July 22<sup>nd</sup> – 25<sup>th</sup> (July 24<sup>th</sup> hours extended to midnight)

Class "C" Fireworks can be sold the following dates June 24<sup>th</sup> – July 25<sup>th</sup>.

When using fireworks, keep a bucket of water nearby, light fireworks one at a time and make sure spectators are out of range of all fireworks. Children should not handle fireworks. Use caution around dry grass, trees, homes and other obstacles. The public is welcome to light their fireworks at Centennial Park on July 4<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup>.




