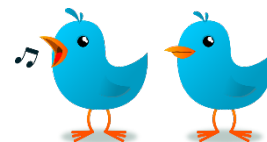

Please attend only one session in case of overcrowding.

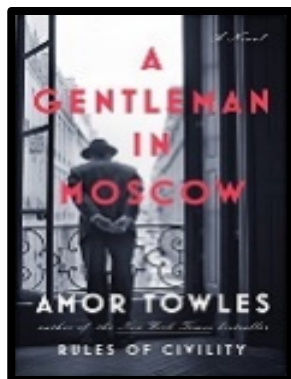

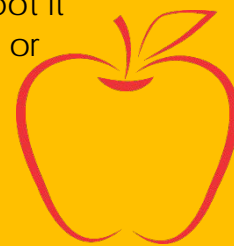


Prize Drawing

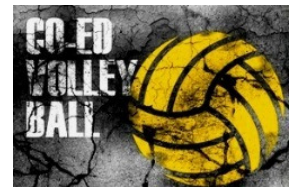

Greetings my fellow citizens of Santaquin,

This month, I wanted to share my thoughts on creating “One Community” and the city’s efforts to bring our community together. Specifically, I wanted to address transportation, recreation and community engagement.

Like many communities, Santaquin has geographic barriers, like the Interstate-15 and Pacific Railroad corridors, which naturally segments our town. For our community, we have the Core Area of town, the East Bench and Summit Ridge. However, regardless of where in the city you reside, we are all residents and citizens of Santaquin City.

To better connect our neighborhoods and remove barriers, Santaquin City has been working on projects such as the Extension of Summit Ridge Parkway to Main Street and the Extension of the Highland Drive frontage Road to the South Interchange. These two projects will enhance overall connectivity, provide secondary access points, lower the response time of our first responders and enhance future economic development. In short, these projects, and others, will help to make the fabric of our community more tight-knit and unified.

We are pleased to announce that the city, after some unexpected delays, has recently entered into an agreement with the developers of the Summit Ridge to share in the costs of extending the Summit Ridge Parkway to Main Street. The bidding for this project is about to be advertised and we anticipate having a general contractor on board in October. We know that there are many question regarding the plans, impacts and schedules. As such, once we have selected the contractor, we will be holding a special Town Hall meeting to bring the community together and answer these questions. This meeting will likely be held in late October or early November. We will advertise the meeting through the city’s newsletter, website and via Facebook pages.

Recreation is another common thread and desire being expressed by every neighborhood in our city. We are very grateful for an energized group of active residents that is gathering the pulse of the community through surveys and studying the possibility of building a Recreation/Aquatics facility. Great thought and planning is necessary to insure that we build a facility that both meets our current and future needs, while also being financially affordable and sustainable. More planning is needed over the next year to insure that all questions are properly answered.

To assist us in the short-term, this group has asked, and the City Council has agreed, to seek the approval of the voters on a Recreational, Arts and Parks (RAP) sales tax. More information will be coming out about this proposal in the weeks ahead. However, in short, this is a 0.1% increase to sales taxes for purchases made within Santaquin City that are not food related. While it is true that, with our limited tax base, this tax will not generate a large amount of money. The money that is generated, if approved, will be used to comprehensively study and plan for the proposed Recreation/Aquatics Center. Should that proposal also be approved in 2019, the funding from the RAP tax would be used to help offset the operational costs of a Recreation/Aquatics Center. Should that project not be approved, the proceeds of the RAP tax would be used to enhance our current recreational programs and make them even better. In either case, we want you to learn about the propose RAP tax and let your voice be heard in November during our general election. Having the opportunity to vote is such a blessing.

Santaquin is such a wonderful community and as I have said before, I am honored to serve you as your mayor. As the city continues to enhance our communication, gather feedback through surveys and work on projects that will remove the walls between our neighborhoods, I would like to ask you to also reach out to be a great neighbor, to become a civic volunteer and to do what you can to make Santaquin the greatest place in the world to live.
