Dear Santaquin Residents and Friends,

I had the honor and pleasure of attending this year's Memorial Day program at our cemetery and wish to express my appreciation to all those who put on this wonderful program. I am so thankful to the members of our community who have served in our military, both past and present, and have sacrificed so much to preserve our freedoms.

I also want to express my appreciation to our Fire Department, and to all those who labored to honor our service members with their Annual Memorial Day Breakfast. What a great event it is each and every year for our community to gather as one.

This year's breakfast was especially touching as our Fire Department is in a state of transition. For those who do not know, our exceptional fire chief for the past six years, Chief Stephen Olson, formally announced his resignation from our department so that he can focus on family and his full time career with the Murray City Fire Department. Chief Olson has done a wonderful job in his efforts to enhance the department's overall capability, skills, knowledge and equipment.
