## Santaquin City Volunteer of the Month

Santaguin Mask Sewing is a group that started on Facebook at the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. It was formed to bring together sewers, cutters, suppliers, and deliverers to provide local first responders and caregivers with face masks, in the south part of Utah County. The group has been able to construct over 400 masks! The group consists of about 100 women in Santaguin but there were key players in the group that did much of the work. Kathleen Provstaaard saw a need in the area and contacted Rachel Cook who then helped form the aroup and coordinate the project. Rachel was instrumental in keeping the group going and she also created 3D Masks to donate. There were many others such as Natalie Hughes who spent a lot of time helping figure out the best way to make fabric masks and how to get supplies. When enough people were not sewing, she texted and called individuals. She asked them to sew 5-10 masks each and she got the ball rolling. Another wonderful helper was Andrea Lloyd. She has sewn almost 200 masks alone. Chyann Kindschy

also made many masks and tons of bias tape. She offered to help in any way and kept sewing until there was no longer a need. Bliss Blackburn was there in the beginning and helped get the group going as well. All these women and many more have truly shown what it means to be a volunteer and have blessed the lives of many people in our community. Thank you for sharing your talents with those who have been on the front line of this pandemic.

<u>YOUTH SPORTS MISSION STATEMENT</u>: The purpose of Santaquin City's Youth Sports Program is to provide quality recreational sport experiences for the community's youth through a positive atmosphere that values sportsmanship, development, and fun for all ages, abilities and interests.

**COACHES NEEDED!** We want to remind you that we changed the way we do things in our youth sports! We will be finding coaches before registering kids! The more coaches we are able to have; the more kids will be able to play! Our goal will be to provide trainings and additional support to our coaches before the season starts! No previous experience required. \*\*\*Youth Wrestling and Youth Volleyball Coach Applications will be available July 13th!

**YOUTH SOCCER:** Registrations started June 29<sup>th</sup> for kids in Preschool (entering kindergarten fall of 2021) through 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Program will start beginning of Aug. and run through Sept. Look online for more game information. Santaquin Recreation jersey is required if participants don't already have one (\$13). Registration numbers will be limited to number of coaches that qualified, register early!





**YOUTH FLAG FOOTBALL:** Coaches applications will be accepted starting June 15<sup>th</sup>!
