Election Information

Due to the number of candidates, a Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, August 10, 2021 to narrow the candidates to two for mayor and four for city council. Mail-in ballots went out July 19th and in person voting will take place at following locations on August 10, 2021 as determined by Utah County:

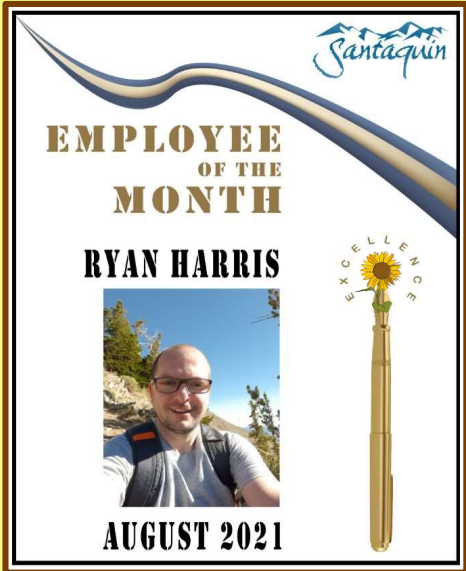

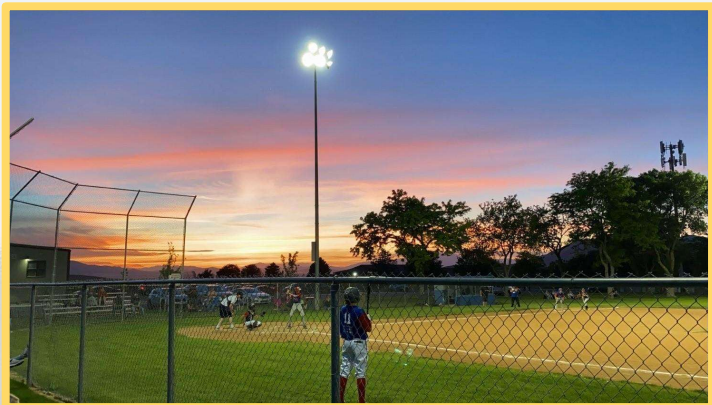
