The Santaquin Fire Department would like everyone to have a safe Independence Day and Pioneer Day. Remember that fireworks may only be discharged **July 2nd through 5th from 11:00 am to 11:00 pm, and until midnight on the 4th and July 22nd through 25th from 11:00 am to 11:00 pm, and until midnight on the 24th.** Fireworks of all kinds, shapes and sizes are prohibited in ALL areas east of I-15, southwest of Rowley's Red Barn and ALL of Summit Ridge.

Dear Santaquin Residents and Friends,

As I look forward to the upcoming holidays in July, Independence Day and Pioneer Day, I gratefully recognize the sacrifices of those who came before us. The freedoms we enjoy in our country were purchased with the ultimate price. Because much of our current generation has lived in relatively peaceful times, we may never fully understand what it means to fight with our lives for freedom. We can, however, honor those who earnestly struggled, against all odds, to keep our precious land free from tyranny. I hope you will take time this month to think about and honor the sacrifices of our military, both the past servicemen and women, and our current enlistments. We have much to be thankful for because of their willingness to serve.

Pioneer Day is also a time to reflect upon the sacrifices made by those who are now gone. Many of our ancestors were driven from place to place to finally trek their way across the continent and into the Utah Territory. The settlement of Summit Creek, now known as Santaquin, was settled in 1851 by religious pioneers

in search of a place where they could practice their faith without oppression. I am so grateful for their sacrifices and hard work in turning this once barren land into the beautiful community we now enjoy. I think they would be pleased to meet the wonderful people who now live here and see how the summit creek area has blossomed.

Speaking of freedoms, election time is here, and we have eight residents running for office. Because there are three candidates running for mayor and five candidates running for two council seats, it is necessary a primary election occur. On August 10, 2021, you will have the right to vote for one mayor candidate and two council candidates. The top two mayor candidates and the top four council candidates will then advance their candidacy in the general election, which will end on voting day, November 2, 2021. Ballots will only be mailed to active registered voters so be sure to check your voter registration by going to vote.utah.gov. I encourage all eligible adults to cast their votes on or before August 10th and November 2nd.
