Dear Santaquin Residents and Friends,

As I look forward to the upcoming holidays in July, Independence Day and Pioneer Day, I gratefully recognize the sacrifices of those who came before us. The freedoms we enjoy in our country were purchased with the ultimate price. Because much of our current generation has lived in relatively peaceful times, we may never fully understand what it means to fight with our lives for freedom. We can, however, honor those who earnestly struggled, against all odds, to keep our precious land free from tyranny. I hope you will take time this month to think about and honor the sacrifices of our military, both the past servicemen and women, and our current enlistments. Ballots will only be mailed to active registered voters so be sure to check your voter registration by going to vote.utah.gov. I

I want to extend my appreciation to the city staff for all they do for our community.
