Notice is hereby given that the Santaquin City Planning Commission will be holding a public hearing at approximately 7:00 P.M. on Tuesday March 10, 2020, in the Courtroom / City Council Chambers on the second floor of Santaquin City Offices, located at 275 West Main Street.

THE PROPOSAL:

Mr. John Smiley and Mr. Kevin Olson are proposing to add 20 townhome units and 6 small commercial spaces in the Orchard Hills townhome subdivision located at approximately 120 East and Highland Drive. The subdivision is located within the Residential Commercial (RC) Zone.

HEARING PURPOSE:

The hearing is an open meeting in which residents will have the opportunity to voice concerns or ask questions about the proposal. Input received during the public hearing will help the Planning Commission understand potential impacts. If the impacts can be appropriately mitigated, the Planning Commission may recommend conditions to do so. The proposed plan must be approved if the plan complies with Santaquin City Code.
